Simpson Desert
Although the Simpson Desert was first visited by Europeans in 1845 (Charles Sturt), the first white person to successfully cross it was Ted Colson in 1936. He then re-crossed it again after spending three days in Birdsville.
Dr Cecil Madigan led the first scientific-based expedition across the Simpson Desert in 1939.

Old Andado
Giles - August 1873 to July 14 1874
Giles' most famous expedition was unsuccessful in crossing the desert to Western Australia. This expedition was named in which Alfred Gibson lost his life. Giles ordered the country that claimed his young companion Gibson's Desert. Despite the problems, Giles explored nearly all of the major features in central Australia west of Uluru (Ayers Rock). Giles later successfully crossed Australia twice at different latitudes through unexplored desert country.

Poeppel Corner
Poeppel originally put the corner post in the middle of Lake Poeppel in 1880, but it was later moved by Lawrence Wells to the edge of the lake after it was determined that the chain used during the survey had lengthened, causing the post to be placed more than 300 metres too far west.

Burke and Wills - August 1860 to June 1861
This ill-fated expedition set out from Melbourne to find a route to the Gulf of Carpentaria. Expedition leader Robert O'Hara Burke with William J Wills, John King and Charles Gray found tidal waters near the Gulf and returned to their depot on Cooper's Creek, only to find it deserted. Burke and his men perished attempting to find the nearest cattle station and King
